The Apple of His Eye Mission Society will be coming to our church next week

The phase, The Apple of His Eye, actually was the name of a planned two-week witnessing training event in New York City (The Big Apple). Rev. Dave Born, one of the key Task Force members, and I sat at a small table at Kennedy airport while between flights. An outline was created for what it would take to conduct an outreach. The result of Rev. Born's hard work was the first *Apple of His Eye* intensive training event in New York City.

Each year we host short-term mission training events where we help pastors and lay people to cultivate personal witnessing skills. These events give them hands-on experience in telling the Good News by going out in teams. So far we have distributed over 600,000 Gospel tracts, one at a time to invite others to hear Jesus.

ON ASHES

It always seems jarring to Lutheran Christians to hear the Gospel appointed for Ash Wednesday (don't disfigure your face to show men you are fasting) and then be invited up to receive ashes on your face! What gives? A direct disobedience to our Lord's commandment?

Most assuredly NOT that. The ashes for which this day is named are not to show ANYONE that you are fasting (for who knows if you are or not?). What they are, is shown by the words accompanying them:

"Remember, O Man, that thou art dust and unto dust thou shalt return."

Thus, the ashes show not fasting, but dying. Remember, O Man, and everyone who sees you - remember one and all - that we are dying. That we are headed for the earth. The words first spoken by our loving God on the day of the Fall ring down the long corridor of the centuries: "Remember! You are dust! To dust you will return!"

But there is more. The ashes are placed on the forehead in the form of a cross. A reminder that though we will surely return to the earth and die, become ashes, as it were, there is One who came among us and did this - one over whom death had NO claim. And His death is the destruction of death itself - the wiping out of sin, the gift of unending life.

Thus the ashes are placed upon a dying people under the sign that this death has itself been transformed by His enduring it for us. You will die, but you will not die hopeless. You will go to the grave in the certainty that He who became dust and ashes for you will RAISE you from the earth to which you have returned and bring

you into the Home He has prepared. Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory to Him forever!!!

Disaster Initiative Workshop March 1st

After the tornado disaster in Joplin, faith based organizations stepped up to the plate to help in many ways. They helped the destroyed and damaged churches in Joplin and provided help in the community. What if Jefferson City experienced a similar level of destruction? Are we ready to respond to the challenges of damages to our facilities? What should our role be to help our community?

The Cole County Emergency Management Agency is holding a workshop for faith-based organizations to discuss plans for responding to a disaster in our community. There will be sessions on developing a continuity of operations for our facilities as well as supporting community shelters after a disaster.

The workshop will be held on March 1, 2012, from 8:30 to noon at the St. Joseph Cathedral Undercroft. A NOTE FORM THE PRESIDENT...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In response to President Obama's announcement Friday concerning an "accommodation" to a previous mandate that health plans must cover all forms of birth control (even those that can kill the unborn), The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) remains deeply concerned. We strongly object to the use of drugs and procedures that are used to take the lives of unborn children, who are persons in the sight of God from the time of conception. Drugs such as "Plan B" and "Ella," which are still included in the mandate, can work post-conception to cause the death of the developing child, so don't be fooled by statements to the contrary.

We see President Obama's action Friday as significant, in that it appears to have been prompted by the many voices united in concern over an infringement of our religious liberties. But the "accommodation" did not expand the exemption for religious employers, nor did it restrict the mandate in any way. It simply described a temporary enforcement delay and a possible future change—a change that, unfortunately, would not adequately protect religious freedom or unborn lives.

We remain opposed to this mandate because it runs counter to the biblical truth of

the sanctity of human life. We are committed to working to ensure that we remain free to practice the teachings of our faith, that our religious rights are not violated, and that our rights of conscience are retained. Freedom of religion extends beyond the practice of our faith in houses of worship. We must be free to put our faith into action in the public square, and, in response to Christ's call, demonstrate His mercy through our love and compassion for all people according to the clear mandate of Holy Scripture.

The government has overstepped its bounds. This controversy is not merely about "birth control" and the Catholic Church's views about it. It's about mandating that we provide medications which kill life in the womb. And moreover, and perhaps even more ominous, it is about an overzealous government forcing coercive provisions that violate the consciences and rights of its citizens. We can no longer expect a favored position for Christianity in this country. But we can, as citizens of this great nation, fight for constitutional sanity against secularizing forces. As we have vividly experienced in discriminatory state legislation with respect to homosexual adoption, we, and our institutions (and those of other religious citizens of good will), are being robbed of the right to the free exercise of religion absent government intrusion or threat. The next assault will come upon church-related retirement facilities. How much longer will it be legal in this country to believe and act according to the dictates of biblical and creedal Christianity?

Jesus bids us, "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Mark 12:17). We will pray for and support our government where we can, but our consciences and lives belong to God.

Can You Keep A Confidence?

A gossip betrays a confidence, but a trustworthy man keeps a secret. Proverbs 11:13

It is no big surprise when people gossip at the hair dressers, the pub or the workplace. But how about the church? Do you think it does not happen? Think again! The reason it is not so obvious there is because we are experts at diguising it. For example, a friend confides in you about a martial problem or their child’s drug addiction, and what do you do? Immediately you get on the phone and notify the prayer chain. You ‘share it ‘ under the guise of asking for prayer.

God says, ‘*Someone of integrity will not violate a confidence.*’ They simply will not! Gossip destroys reputations and severs friendships. Worst of all, it keeps people from opening up and getting the help they need. That is why God categorizes it along with murder (Romans 1:29). If you think that sounds extreme read this: ‘*The words of a talebearer are as wounds...they go down into the innermost parts...*’(Proverbs 18:8). Thoughtless words break hearts!

So why does God come down so hard on this? Because it says to the world His people cannot be trusted; that somebody with a problem is safer in a self-help group than church. Sadly some of the worst offenders are Christian leaders with loose tongues who seek to impress their peers by divulging the details of somebody else’s struggles. Shame on us! We need to pray, ‘*Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord...*’ (Psalm 19:14). So, can you keep a confidence? Prove it!

Prayer: *Heavenly Father, Forgive me when I have failed to keep a confidence and help me to be a person who can be trusted with the sufferings of others. Amen*

A Prayer for the Week:

Jesus, Son of God, open our ears and our hearts so that we listen to you. Amen.

For every cup and every plateful, to you, O God, we're very grateful. Amen.

May the Lord lift you up when you are weak and give you strength when you are tired. Amen.

DEVOTIONS:

If your congregation does not have a worship service, you can observe Ash Wednesday (February 22) in your home. Mark one another with ashes made by burning some paper and crushing it into fine ashes. Then, mix the ashes with a small amount of olive oil. Make the sign of the cross on one another's foreheads as you say these words:

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn back to God and believe in Jesus, your Savior.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS:

This week, Lent begins! Begin your household preparations by observing Shrove Tuesday (February 21). The name “shrove” comes from the practice of being “shriven” – going to church, confessing your sins and being forgiven – before the start of Lent. Shrove Tuesday is also sometimes known as Pancake Tuesday or Fat Tuesday, because households used up their remaining eggs and fats before Lent by making pancakes on this day. Here are some ideas for Shrove Tuesday:

- Have a pancake breakfast or dinner. As you eat, talk about what Jesus gave up for our sake, and what you might wish to give up for Lent to help you prepare spiritually for Holy Week.
- Have a household party with special dessert foods, party hats and an “Alleluia” sign. Prepare a box, covered with purple paper and a foil cross on top. Eat your meal, sing a party song, and welcome in Lent with noisemakers. At the end of the meal, “bury” the noisemakers and the “Alleluia” sign in the box. Open the box again on Easter Sunday.

CARING CONVERSATIONS:

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time when you were scared. What did you do?
- In Mark 9:2-9 we hear about an amazing experience that Peter, James and John had one day. How do you think you would have reacted?
- God spoke from the cloud and told Jesus’ disciples to listen to Jesus. How does listening to Jesus help us when we are scared or fearful?

Make this week “secret service” week in your home. Put your household member’s names in a hat and have each person draw out someone else’s name. They are to do some form of “secret service” for that person during the week.
