

## Why are We Here Today?

We believe that God created the world in perfection, but because of sin, the world is now broken and fragmented. Through Jesus Christ and His death and resurrection, God has launched His plan to redeem and recreate the world in its original goodness. ## Holy Communion at Trinity

We believe that in the Lord's Supper, God gives us not only bread and wine, but also the very body and blood of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of our sins. Our Lord invites all to his table who believe this and repent of all sins. Visitors who hold a different confession of faith from this congregation yet desire to commune are asked to speak to one of the pastors before the service. We offer gluten-free wafers, and non-alcoholic wine is available in the center of the individual trays.

### **Collect of the Day**

O God, You have prepared for those who love You such good things as surpass our understanding. Cast out all sins and evil desires from us, and pour into our hearts Your Holy Spirit to guide us into all blessedness; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

### **Old Testament Reading**

*Isaiah 65:1–9*

I was ready to be sought by those who did not ask for me; I was ready to be found by those who did not seek me. I said, “Here am I, here am I,” to a nation that was not called by my name. I spread out my hands all the day to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices; a people who provoke me to my face continually, sacrificing in gardens and making offerings on bricks; who sit in tombs, and spend the night in secret places; who eat pig’s flesh, and broth of tainted meat is in their vessels; who say, “Keep to yourself, do not come near me, for I am too holy for you.” These are a smoke in my nostrils, a fire that burns all the day. Behold, it is written before me: “I will not keep silent, but I will repay; I will indeed repay into their bosom both your iniquities and your fathers’ iniquities together, says the Lord; because they made offerings on the mountains and insulted me on the hills, I will measure into their bosom payment for their former deeds.”

Thus says the Lord: “As the new wine is found in the cluster, and they say, ‘Do not destroy it, for there is a blessing in it,’ so I will do for my servants’ sake, and not destroy them all. I will bring forth offspring from Jacob, and from Judah possessors of my mountains; my chosen shall possess it, and my servants shall dwell there.”

## Epistle

*Galatians 3:23–4:7*

Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. And if you are Christ’s, then you are Abraham’s offspring, heirs according to promise.

I mean that the heir, as long as he is a child, is no different from a slave, though he is the owner of everything, but he is under guardians and managers until the date set by his father. In the same way we also, when we were children, were enslaved to the elementary principles of the world. But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, “Abba! Father!” So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God.


## Holy Gospel

*Luke 8:26–39*

Then they sailed to the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. When Jesus had stepped out on land, there met him a man from the city who had demons. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he had not lived in a house but among the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out and fell down before him and said with a loud voice, “What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me.” For he had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many a time it had seized him. He was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the desert.) Jesus then asked him, “What is your name?” And he said, “Legion,” for many demons had entered him. And they begged him not to command them to depart into the abyss. Now a large herd of pigs was feeding there on the hillside, and they begged him to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. Then the demons came out of the man and entered the pigs, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned.

When the herdsmen saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country. Then people went out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons had gone, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in

his right mind, and they were afraid. And those who had seen it told them how the demon-possessed man had been healed. Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him, but Jesus sent him away, saying, “Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you.” And he went away, proclaiming throughout the whole city how much Jesus had done for him.



## Trinity Voters Assembly

Summary of June 4, 2019 Meeting

Pastor Powell gave a review of Trinity's response to the Tornado disaster last week. Trinity hosted volunteers from Lutheran Early Response Teams (LERT) from Missouri and Illinois who provided help to Trinity members and other Jefferson City and Cole County residents impacted by the tornado. Teams began arriving Thursday evening with the final team leaving Sunday afternoon. We provided meals and lodging in our old gym using some grant funds and food and volunteer assistance from Trinity and Faith Lutheran Church. Thank you to Caleb Fischer for coordinating the relief activities.

Pastor and Mrs. Schlie will close on their house on the 21st of June. Pastor Schlie will be installed on the 29th of June at the 6PM service and will be preaching on Sunday morning.

Treasurer's report - We think that we will end the fiscal year with a \$10, 000 deficit. We budgeted for \$47,000 deficit. At Council, all Boards were asked to limit spending for the rest of the fiscal year.

Trustees Permission was obtained from the City Council to tear down the old house. Demolition will begin soon. The Trustees continue with other projects for this summer including renovating two school classrooms and other maintenance activities.


**New Business:** The Finance Board presented a proposed budget for the July, 2019 -June, 2020 fiscal year with a deficit of \$114,558.00. This proposal provides for an increase in salary for employee longevity and for those two teachers who will be completing their Master's program in June 2019. Both of these salary adjustments are based upon Synod, Missouri District Guidelines. No increase in base salary is recommended. Budgets of several of the church boards were reduced. The salary for the part time teacher's aide was deleted from the budget. It is hoped that funding for this position will be identified from other sources. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve a budget that includes the numbers as presented by the Finance Board for a deficit budget of \$114,558.00. Ballot vote: yes 30, no 11. Motion carried.

At the June Church Council meeting, the Council agreed to support this deficit budget. During this next year strategies will be identified to balance future budgets by both increasing income and cutting expenditures. If funds are needed to cover church/school expenditures during FY 19-20, we will borrow from the Building Fund to be paid back with interest. In order to assure adequate funds for this purpose, the plans to repair the brick work on the church and school buildings will be delayed. It was suggested that if every giving unit (or member household) would increase their giving by \$20 a month, we could meet or exceed our budget needs.

Full reports of all church and school activities will be included in the final minutes of this meeting.

# 46th Annual March for Life

January 22-25, 2020
