I. Call to order and attendance

- V. Principal's Report:
 - Discussed recent activities at school including VIP day and the State Archery tournament where middle school got 1st in bullseye and around 25 students qualified for nationals.
 - Upcoming field trips for 6th and 7th graders are being planned.
 - Still searching for 5th grade teacher (2 calls have been issued but were declined, committee meeting to discuss other candidates)

VI. Old Business:

a. Approval of December Minutes: Secretary Amy Lage advised minutes will be printed in Tiger
 Tales and had paper copies available for review. All in Favor and minutes approved.

VII. New Business:

- a. Financial Update:
 - Balance sheets available and reviewed.

- Working on moving all funds to Central Bank account.
- There is quite a bit of money available.
- Discussed where actual amounts are \$0 but money has been budgeted- amounts for budget are based on 5 year average so example: curriculum has \$20,000 budgeted but \$0 spent there may not be a need for curriculum this year but amount will roll over for next year.
- Other items currently at \$0 but that may still be spent this year include end of year party.

b. Tiger Fest earnings:

- Very successful year as attendees were down but earnings were up.
- Concern brought up that there should be more transparency on how funds plan to be spent. Moving forward instead of "funds go to PTL" specific projects will be named.
- Voted on and approved to spend some Tiger Fest funds on \$500 amazon gift cards for all full time staff/teachers and \$250 amazon gift cards for all part time staff/teachers (if teacher is leaving, it will go to new classroom teacher).

c. Playground Project

- Voted and approved to begin planning for playground updates.
- Google forms for wants/ideas will be sent to teachers first, parents, and possibly students.
- Plans for a possible school spirit store to help raise funds.
- Grants are available for scrap tire surface (possibly \$50,000).
- Possible ideas include:
 - o Additional gates for security so once kids are outside they are enclosed.
 - New surface as the current tiles get twigs caught in between and cause issues.
 - Possible donor stones.
 - Bigger playground.
 - More grass.
 - o Bigger eating area.

d. 8th grade contribution and future years

- \$1,000 was allotted for project graduation but 8th grade didn't spend all of it.
- Voted and approved to continue to give \$1,000 for future years.
- e. Events and Projects: Teacher Appreciation Week
 - Planning on doing things each day, check Facebook group for opportunities to help.
 - May 28th teacher appreciation luncheon at River Region Credit Union. Lunch for teachers and gifts for teachers leaving with their families invited.
 - Woo Woo wagon is a cart that goes around to teachers every other week with snacks. Plans to include this as a line item on future budgets.
- f. Events and projects: Trinity Carnival/Fun Fest
 - Used to be a back to school fall event where different classrooms had carnival type games/activities.
 - Food truck will be available.
 - Discussed this would have to be cleared with teachers first and any classrooms used would have to have teacher approval as well.
 - Discussed possibly using Calvary Students to help with unsupervised students (older students who may leave their parents while there).

- Families would buy tickets to play games and this would be a fundraiser possibly for playground updates.
- g. Next year: Tiger Fest 2025
 - Date set for March 1^{st.}
 - Theme set for "Blast from the Past" or "Roaring through the Decades".
 - Each VIP table would get their table decorated according to the decade they choose.
 - Tiger Fest committee members needed.
- h. Next Year: Election of Officers
 - President and Treasurer terms are up this year.
 - Cassie Huckabay and Kelly Volmert ran and approved to serve additional term (2 years).
